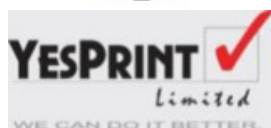

Surrey Heath Borough Commander

I am aware of the concerns many Surrey Heath residents have due to the dramatic increase in burglaries of late. Some have occurred whilst residents were at home and were confronted by offenders. I do not underestimate how terrifying this must have been to those victims. We are not alone in this rise; neighbouring areas including Spelthorne, Runnymede, Thames Valley Policing area, have all seen similar increases. It is difficult to ascertain whether we have one team of professional burglars hitting us at the moment or more than one. Suffice to say we are doing all we can, in conjunction with colleagues from other areas to identify those responsible; we have deployed plain clothes officers in unmarked cars as well as marked vehicles and colleagues from support teams such as traffic and firearms; we have some promising forensic lines of enquiry and I am really hopeful that these will lead to arrests soon. Meanwhile, please keep reporting suspicious activity, noting of vehicle registrations and clothing of any suspects.

This summer has been especially busy with officers from the Surrey Heath team being abstracted to support numerous

events in both Surrey and Sussex, at the cost of officers having days off cancelled, sometimes at very short notice. I wish to express in this publication my thanks and gratitude to my team for their hard work and commitment in continuing to come to work with a positive attitude despite the relentless pace of the last few months. Examples of abstractions are the Epsom Derby event, Pride events in Brighton, Labour party conference in Brighton, Policing oil drilling protests in the East of the county, contingency staffing for Brexit; all this when dealing with the everyday demands on the team. We are now approaching the run up to Christmas, which will also see an increase in demand for our services whilst staffing levels continue to be a challenge so I doubt there will be much of a let up for the team.

I continue to receive a number of lovely emails and letters praising the work that officers from my team do and I would like to thank those residents who have taken the time to write for doing so. I cannot tell you how much that means to the officers to be acknowledged in that way. It really does make it worthwhile and is a reminder as to why we joined the job.

Surrey Police Crime Reduction Advice Police Update

Crime prevention advice issued following high value jewellery thefts in the North and West of Surrey:

We're reminding the public of our burglary crime prevention advice following a number of recent reports about high value jewellery theft in the North and West of Surrey.

In recent weeks a number of reports have been received in the Frimley and Camberley area. Since the start of August 2019 we have received 35 reports of burglaries or attempted burglaries targeting gold or high value jewellery in the Surrey Heath area.

In the North of the county in the same period 94 reports have been received mainly in the Elmbridge and Runnymede areas.

Detective Superintendent Peter Fulton said: *"Proactive teams have been working with our colleagues from local neighbourhood teams to carry out regular patrols and to gather information which will help to confirm which of these reports may be linked."*

Report suspicious activity to Surrey Police by calling 101 as this may provide a vital piece of information to progress our enquiries.

"If you see anyone acting suspiciously in your street or a vehicle that doesn't seem to belong there please do call in to tell us.

"If you have CCTV installed at your home or business please familiarise yourself with how the system works and how to download footage. This will help us to circulate suitable images relating to burglary as quickly as possible to officers across the county and neighbouring forces.

What links many of these reports is the presence of high value gold jewellery, which is then stolen.

"I would ask the Asian community to consider our crime prevention advice if they have high value jewellery in their homes, as a high proportion of these offences have targeted Asian families.

In the North of the county many reports relate to burglaries carried out between 3pm and 7pm.

"I'd therefore remind people of our message to lock up properly and to leave a light on if they are going out because the evenings are getting darker earlier following the end of British Summer Time."

Surrey Police is working hard to reduce the number of burglaries across the county, including those where high-value gold and jewellery is targeted.

You can help to deter a burglar from entering your home and stealing your valuable possessions by following these simple crime prevention measures:

- Keep all jewellery and other valuables in a safety deposit box if your bank offers this service.
- If you have to keep your jewellery at home, invest in a home safe. Your insurance company will provide advice as to the best safe to suit your needs. Ensure that the safe is out of sight, securely bolted down and ideally professionally installed.
- Keep an inventory of your jewellery, either on paper or via a company such as www.immobilise.com; include identifying marks and the value.
- In addition, photograph your jewellery against a plain background using a ruler to give an idea of size.
- Check your home insurance to ensure that it covers keeping high-value jewellery at home.
- Install a house alarm from a NSI registered company. nsi.org.uk, and dusk to dawn, sensor activated security lighting, to the front of your house. Always make sure doors and windows are locked and secure when you go out.
- Make sure your home looks occupied when you are out or away. Use an automatic timer switch to turn interior lights on and off.
- Consider your privacy settings on any social media platforms and avoid posting about weddings, festivals or other celebrations, where someone may be able to identify that you are not at home or that you own high value jewellery.
- Try to avoid decorating the outside of your home during religious festivals and events. This could attract burglars, as they may believe that jewellery or other valuables are inside the address.
- Mark your property with a forensic marking product such as selectadna.co.uk.

Surrey Police tackling rural crime

Equipment and tool security can be a particular issue for rural businesses and farms. To keep your belongings safe:

- lock equipment away in a secure building or part of a building when not in use
- invest in a secure storage toolbox
- install a burglar alarm on buildings where equipment is kept
- always lock vehicles when left outside and keep the keys in your possession
- keep expensive items and vehicles out of sight when not in use
- consider using hitch locks, wheel clamps or ground anchors
- mark your tools and equipment and register them for free with Immobilise

- keep a record of all valuable items
- consider fitting outside security lights.

Officers say they want to educate, engage with our rural communities and assure

them that we take crimes, which occur in rural areas seriously. Crime in rural area is still a crime.
